The students are tutoring the children via email in Math and English. They have also begun an ambitious fundraising project to raise \$500 for the Prashanti kids by the end of this year. URGENTLY NEEDED – FIRST PHASE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW SCHOOL COMPLEX

Dear Friends and Supporters of Prashanti School, Puri,

On behalf of the fatherless, destitute and rural village children whom we are providing with a high quality, English-medium education at low cost, we wish to inform you of our urgent need. Most urgently needed is the foundation and ground floor classrooms for the new school complex. This needs to be completed during the present dry season, by God's grace and your loving help.

Beyond class 5 there will be absolutely no classroom space left. If the ground floor is finished, we will be able to offer all the higher school classes 6 through 10.

FOUNDATION – approx. cost 23 lakh rupees = approx. \$38,333

8 GROUND FLOOR CLASSROOMS – approx. cost 20 lakh rupees per classroom = approx. \$33,333 per classroom

Please open your hearts to these children and ones who will come in the future and give them a school in which they can grow into dedicated responsible citizens of mother India and the world.

Omri comes from a large family as he is one of 8 children, he has 5 sisters and 2 brothers. Omri's mother stays at home to look after the children and his father works in construction when there is work available. Any help with

funding his tuition fees would greatly help his family.

Yosef is 6 years old. His favorite subject is Mathematics. When asked what he wishes for the year ahead he said that he knew he was average in his subjects and he wants to excel in them (especially in Mathematics, Arabic, and Hebrew) in order to make his parents proud. His teacher says he was being too hard on himself and that he had improved in leaps and bounds since starting first grade. Yosef has many friends in his class.

His father works in construction but does not always have work and his mother works part time at the NSWAS kindergarten and cleaning at the NSWAS hotel while also studying for her degree in education.
