Odisha Culture and Traditions

As well as learning English and studying hard, it is important for our PS children to learn about their own culture. Children who come from extreme poverty, from marginalized backgrounds, even living on the streets at times, often do not have anyone to teach them about the traditions of their own culture. This lack of understanding further isolates them and makes it more difficult for them to cross social boundaries and break the cycle of poverty that has defined their families for generations. To lift a child out of deep poverty, a well-rounded education must



include culture, art, music, dance and public speaking, in addition to academics!

Maa Mangala Puja

On four successive Sunday nights in September, the girls do their own puja (prayers) to the Divine Mother Maa Mangala (her name means Auspicious Blessings). This puja is made for young girls to learn and understand traditional worship of the Divine Mother to bring blessings for their home and all family members. On the final Sunday night they all put on saris and new bangles and perform the puja themselves. They do not even look like little girls on this last night but look like daughters of the Divine Mother Mangala herself!



After the girls have finished their schooling, whether graduating high school or college, they may choose to marry and they will be be wonderful wives and mothers for their families. Understanding their own culture helps these children to participate fully in their communities.



Yoga Classes

Part of the cultural program for the children at Prashanti School is the study of hatha yoga. Fortunately a wonderful yoga instructor has a studio directly across the street from PS, and he comes on a regular basis to teach. Yoga helps develop strength, flexibility, balance, focus and concentration. His classes are a favorite with the kids!







Ras Purnima

Ras Purnima is a special time to celebrate and remember Lord Krishna. It is said that it was at this time in the fall that the little boy Krishna and the gopis (milkmaids) danced together in Ras Lila dance. Every gopi danced with her own little Sri Krishna and all rode on a boat together on this full moon night in November. So little children remember this wonderful time by floating little boats on ponds, rivers or the ocean. All the PS children created boats, decorated them with flowers, and floated them on our little pond that has a statue of Krishna in the middle. Some of the older boys created a motorized boat!

Free Eye Check-Up and Glasses

A free eye check up for the children and staff of Prashanti School was held on November 8 at the school. It was sponsored by the S.M Foundation, Saroj Mahapatra, founder, and performed by the Vision Care Eye Hospital of Bhubaneswar and Dr. Srimant Ku. Mishra



with team members Jalandhar Adhikari, optomologist, Jayendra Nayak and Nirmal Ch. Mishra.

All received eye tests for vision, and it was found that 11 kids and staff members needed glasses! Some also needed eye drops for Vitamin A deficiency, itchy eyes, dry eyes and tearing eyes. On November 28, Saroj and Gayatri Mohapatra came to visit and distribute the new glasses. The eye camp was a great success, and everyone was very happy.
